Please join us with your renewed support as we continue to live by this law of love in the coming year. And, again, many thanks for all your support this past year.



PLEASE NOTE: During fiscal year 2014-2015, we are apportioning our various administrative costs to the actual programs they support, rather than assigning them to our executive-office cost center, which had been the practice heretofore. This new method will show that the majority of our administrative costs enable our direct service to Catholic Charities clients, whereas one could infer from the chart above that the agency spends a disproportionate number of dollars on general administration, which is not, and never has been, the case. Next year's report will reflect this new approach.

By the Numbers | From July 1, 2013, to June 30, 2014

Allen County

Adoption and pregnancy

Placement, connections, and general services for families interested in adoption. Forty family home studies were completed during the fiscal year.

ECHO (Education Creates Hope and Opportunity)

To help pregnant and parenting teens and younger adults complete their education. Forty-one students (with 40 children involved) received services. Seven of eight clients scheduled to graduate received diplomas or GEDs.

Hispanic Health Advocate

Spanish speakers (111 adults and 87 children) received interpretation and translation services for 524 medical appointments.

Immigration

There were 352 immigration consultations and 384 immigration applications filed, among which 307 applications were approved by United States Citizenship and Immigration Services. Sixty-five attended citizenship classes, and 223 received translation services.

Indiana Hardest Hit/HoosierCorps Program

For those who are unemployed through no fault of their own, in need of mortgage assistance, and choose volunteer service as their activity component. Thirty-eight clients served at 58 registered host sites.

Refugee Resettlement-all programs

A total of 215 refugees received reception and placement services, 63 refugees and asylees received job training through the Match Grant Program, and 522 refugees and asylees received job development services. A total of 112 refugees received ongoing case management. Homework Help assisted 175 students, and 220 refugees received screening services through the Department of Health.

Resource and Referral

A total of 241 families received limited case management and financial assistance. A total of 726 were served (separating food, utilities, etc.).

Senior AIDES

Job training for low-income adults 55 and older. Fifty people received job training at 31 host sites.

Villa of the Woods Residential Community

Sixteen residents received services; 4,530 days of care were provided.

St. Joseph and other counties

Adoption and pregnancy

Accomplished were one infant adoptive placement, 10 family home studies, counseling for four birthparents, and search and reunion services for 10 people.

ECHO

Forty-seven students (22 children involved) received services; 20 of 22 scheduled to graduate received diplomas or GEDs.

Indiana Hardest Hit/HoosierCorps Program

There were 46 participants at 24 host sites in St. Joseph County and 28 participants at 46 host sites in other counties.

Senior AIDES

Twenty-five participants received job training at 31 host sites in St. Joseph County, and 53 people received job training at 30 sites in outlying counties.

South Bend Food Pantry

Served were 3,637 households (932 new). A total of 12,958 individuals were served, and 72,740 pounds of food were distributed.

DeKalb and other county programs

RSVP Community Center of Caring Food Pantry Served were 5,249 families (428 new) representing 20,166 individuals (1,502 new). A total of 219,324 pounds of food was distributed.

RSVP Mentoring

Mentors are matched with at-risk children ages 9 to 17. Six matches have been made.

RSVP of St Joseph and Elkhart Counties

There were 461 senior volunteers at 48 stations, providing 73,238 volunteer hours.

RSVP of DeKalb, LaGrange, Noble and Steuben Counties

There were 266 senior volunteers at 37 stations, providing 60,600 volunteer hours. Included were 1,010 tax returns filed through the VITA program, the distribution of 629 backpacks filled with school supplies, 307 children screened for Amblyopia (lazy eye), and 1,362 individuals receiving winter clothing during Share the Warmth.
